Marc Donovan



Marc grew up in Long Island, NY, and started riding at the age of eight. Early in his riding career, he showed Pony Hunters and later in the Equitation divisions. He was a member of Meadow Brook Hounds Pony Club and received his A rating in 1986.

After studying for two years at Rochester Institute of Technology, Marc continued his education at Emerson College and graduated with a degree in communications. Throughout college he rode horses and competed in Eventing across the East Coast. In the 1990s, he rode his horse Middlemarch to the CCI** level.

In the past several years Marc has designed show jumping courses for many competitions including the Carolina International CIC, US Pony Finals, Gal-

way International CCI, Plantation Fields CIC, Richland Park CIC, Bromont CCI in Canada, and the American Eventing Championships. Marc assisted Richard Jeffery at the 2011 National Horse Show and assisted Richard and Conrad Homfeld at the 2010 World Equestrian Games. He is USEF 'R' licensed show jump course designer and the Eventing Director at the Carolina Horse Park in Raeford, NC.

Linda Zang

In 1965 Linda achieved both her USPC A and also her BHSAI certificate to set the stage for her career in the horse industry. She continued her education by traveling to Ireland and Sweden to work with many European trainers and to attend the national school for instructors (for two years) where she received an instructors certification in Scandinavia in 1970. She returned to the United States in 1972 and competed in national level dressage competitions. In 1978 Linda competed at the World Championships in Goodwood, England and Germany as a recipient of the Amis Fund. She was a member of the US Dressage Team for the Pan American Games in 1979 and a member of the US Olympic Team in 1980.





Alumni Biographies

Linda is a FEI 5* Judge (one of 25 judges of this ranking in the World) and is a member of the FEI Judges Supervisory Panel and has judged the top international championships in the World including: FEI World Cup Finals, Olympics, World Equestrian Games, Pan American Games and European Championships. Besides judging Linda has been an FEI Technical Delegate for Pan American Games and Olympic Games plus others and has extensively judged in many countries around the globe. Linda is currently a member of the USEF Licensed Officials Committee but has been a member and advisor on many USDF and FEI Committees. Linda was honored by the President of the United States for the Gerald Ford "Sports Ambassador" and the U.S. Congressional Gold Medal of Honor and she continues to promote and support Dressage in the United States.

The USPC National Youth Congress was established in 1998 in order to recognize outstanding older Pony Club members that have achieved a National Certification. The National Youth Congress delegates are selected yearly by their regions and come



from all over the country. Two days prior to the Annual Meeting, these delegates are brought together for a series of workshops and discussions intended to expand their awareness of themselves and of the rapidly changing external world into which they will soon graduate.



She is a graduate A from Virginia Region, Regional Supervisor of the Southwest Region, president and occasional field master of Caza Ladron Hunt, and a lifelong eventer. Nancy has served on the Quiz Committee and judged Quiz phases at Western Championships and Festival for several years. In 2005 she was inducted in the Academy of Achievement and in 2006 she joined the Board of Governors, chairing the Communications Committee from 2008 to the present. She has a C-3 daughter who is was a 2007 NYC delegate and who graduated from Kansas City Art Institute majoring in 3-D animation, now studying at Canada's Vancouver Film School. Emily's research investigates mechanisms the cell uses to regulate the reading of genetic information – how genes are appropriately turned on or off, or finely tuned in their expression. She regularly publishes her work in this area, and she recently received a grant from the National Science Foundation to support both her research and the development of a national initiative to involve undergraduates in genomics research. Emily has kept horses, and particularly Pony Club, as a priority in her life. Since graduating as an 'A', she continues to compete in dressage and eventing. She has been a National Examiner for 11 years and devotes much of her summer to clinics and testings.
